Palm Sunday of the Passion 2018

Today we celebrate our Palm Sunday Liturgy, which marks the beginning of our Holv Week. The Passion overshadows Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. This is the most sacred week of the Church's Liturgical Year. I encourage all of you to enter into the spirit of this 'Great Week.'

Our Lenten Fast ends on Holy Thursday, and the Triduum of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection begins. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday is at 8.00pm at St. Edmund's. It reminds us of those events long ago, when Jesus instituted the gift of the Holy Eucharist as the eternal



gift of Himself to the Church. The Mandatum (The Washing of Feet) is the selfless example of love and service that Jesus showed to his friends; he asks each one of us to do the same! We journey with Our Lord to the Garden of Gethsemene, and watch with him until midnight.



**GOOD FRIDAY** This most powerful day! Our Lord walks the most painful road to Calvary. At 3.00pm at St. Edmund's we commemorate The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This is a simple liturgy with the Reading of the Passion from St. John's Gospel, and the

very beautiful Veneration of the Cross, followed by Holy Communion. This is the only day of the year that holy Mass is not celebrated!

HOLY SATURDAY: We share in the Easter Vigil commencing at 7.30pm at St. Edmund's. This very rich and elaborate ceremony encapsulates the whole of Salvation History; and together, we rejoice in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Please make every effort to attend the Triduum Services, as they are seen as one continual celebration. Please share in the first Mass of the Resurrection with us.
