Dear Friends in Christ,

Fifth Sunday of Easter 2018

The vine is frequently used in the Old Testament as a symbol of Israel. Israel is the vine, but Jesus is the true vine. Developing this analogy of the vine we learn that we are branches and branches need pruning. We cannot produce fruit, the fruit of the Holy Spirit, unless we are pruned. Furthermore, we cannot produce fruit unless we remain in the vine.

Now in nature a branch doesn't have much choice but to remain attached to the vine and because of this can produce the fruit of the vine — the grape - which gives us the blessing and fruit of wine. In the spiritual life, however, we can easily separate ourselves from the vine, and in order to remain with the vine (Christ) we enter the doorway of faith and take up the battle of prayer. The idea



or notion remaining in Christ is about practising the presence of God. We tend to think that professional religious people – months, religious sisters, the clergy – find it easier to 'remain' in Christ than we do. Their vocation obliges them to say the Daily Office and to cultivate an active prayer life. However, lay people are called to do the same. We may not say the Divine Office (although many do), but we can certainly practice the presence of God during our day.

Now we all this isn't easy — we are easily distracted and often sidetracked. We can start off our day with the best intentions, but before we know it, the day is dragging us downwards, not upwards, and God's presence seems very far away indeed. What are we to do when this happens? The answer will shock you: laugh, smile and rejoice. God knows we are easily distracted, God knows that we need help and strength to live in his presence.



God isn't shocked by our weakness but rather assures us that when we are weak, then we are strong. We remain in God's presence through taking simple steps, little gestures, and easy movements. Pray during the day today, 'Lord have mercy on me a sinner.' Or, 'Lord, send forth you Spirit and renew the face of the dearth.' These simple prayers over time, if we persevere, will allow us to live and abide in God's presence during the day

This weekend, I would like to welcome once again Fr. Kieran Dodd, who has kindly offered to supply for me while I take a very belated Easter break. Sadly, this may well be the last time Fr Kieran is able to come and supply in the parish, as he has taken up a new assignment as Chaplain to a Convent of Nuns. I would like to take this public opportunity of expressing my sincere and grateful thanks to Fr. Kieran who, for over twelve years, has been coming to



our parish. It's extremely difficult finding a substitute priest these days, so my gratitude is heartfelt! He has been a tremendous friend to me for nearly forty years, and the fact that he has been supplying throughout our diocese for so many years is truly wonderful! Fr. Kieran will be 86 years of age on 5th May, so we wish him many happy returns. I hope and pray that he will be very happy in his new assignment with the Little Company of Mary Sisters in Westcliff-on-Sea. Please keep him in your prayers.

During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. PARISH FINANCES: A few weeks ago we had an appeal from Carlos Camacho regarding the Parish Gift Aid Scheme. A few new people have joined the scheme. If you are a Tax Payer and you regularly contribute to the Weekly Offertory, and, as yet do not belong to the Gift Aid Scheme, I ask you to seriously consider joining as soon as possible. We are able to claim back 25pence in the pound for every pound you donate; e.g. if you contribute £10 per week, with Gift Aid envelopes we claim back an extra £2.50. At the end of the year, this amounts to a considerable sum. In truth the offertories have diminished over the past few years; but the bills still keep coming in. I have just paid the Gas Bill for March £872.50 for all our buildings. The Monthly Diocesan Quota is £2,260.00. The Incoming Offertory for March did not meet the outgoing by approximately £4,500.00. This cannot be maintained on a monthly basis! Obviously, I'm very aware of families' financial situations. If you're in a position to be able to increase your offertory contribution this would be greatly appreciated!

LOUGHTON PARISH GIFT AID SCHEME: Many thanks to all the parishioners who have collected their new Gift Aid Envelopes. The New Financial Year commences this weekend. Would those who have, as yet, not picked up their new envelopes kindly do so as so as possible? The use of the GA envelopes is extremely important; we are not allowed to claim any tax back if the envelopes are not used. There are always spare envelopes in the porch of the Church. If you do not belong to the Parish Gift Aid Scheme, and someone in the family pays Income Tax then please consider joining. It is very simple in that we only require you to complete the GA From with your name and address and Brian Carter will do the rest. Please think seriously about joining the scheme! We are able to claim back 25pence in the pound for every pound you donate in your envelopes. E.g. if you give £10 per week, we receive an additional £2.50 per week.
